



Important Reminder

As we continue to face challenges with Dangerous Goods (DG) irregularities, it is important to restate and highlight the process to ensure compliance and safety in all shipments. Below is a summary of the key steps:

Import

Visual Inspection of Shipment:

- Confirm DG & Handling labels are correctly affixed.
- Look for any visible signs of damage to the shipment.

Storage of DG:

- Store all Dangerous Goods in their designated DG storage location.
- Follow the approved segregation chart for proper classification.

Verify Shipment Details:

- Ensure the shipment received matches the waybill details.

Build-Up

Review Build-Up Instructions:

- Ensure thorough understanding of the build-up guidelines.

Confirm with DG

Coordinator/Supervisor:

- Ensure that all DG listed in the build-up instructions has been inspected, loaded, and secured properly.

Retrieve DG Shipment:

- Collect DG from the designated DG location.

Inspect Shipment for Damage:

- Visually inspect the shipment again for any signs of damage.

Final Check Before Shipment Departs:

- Prior to the shipment leaving the warehouse, the DG Coordinator/Supervisor must verify all DG is loaded, manifested, and in compliance with build-up instructions.

IATA Compliance:

- Complete the build-up following the IATA DG regulations for safe handling.

By following these detailed steps, we can reduce potential irregularities and enhance safety during DG handling. **Remember, compliance and careful attention to detail are key in ensuring the safe transportation of Dangerous Goods.**
