You Are the "Eyes" and "Ears" of Security at the Airport

As a member of Choice Aviation Services, YOU play a vital role in ensuring the safety and security of our operations. We rely on you to stay vigilant and aware of your surroundings. Security is everyone's responsibility—your actions help protect our workplace, our colleagues, and our customers.

1. Protect and Report Loss of Your ID Badge:

- Your ID Badge is a critical tool for access to secure areas.
- If your ID badge is lost or stolen, report it immediately to your supervisor and the security team.
- Never leave your ID badge unattended, always keep it secure.

3. Report **Unauthorized Persons:**

- Always be aware of who is around you, especially in restricted areas.
- If you notice someone without proper identification or authorization, report them immediately to security or your supervisor.
- Don't assume someone else will report it—security is everyone's responsibility.

2. Use Only as Authorized:

- Your ID badge grants access to specific areas based on your role use it only for its intended purpose.
- Unauthorized access is prohibited. Violations may result in disciplinary actions.

4. Do Not Lend or Misuse Your ID Badge:

- Your ID badge is personal and nontransferable—never lend it to another individual.
- Sharing or misusing your ID badge compromises airport security and puts everyone at risk.
- Any misuse may lead to serious consequences, including the suspension of access privileges.

5. Stay Alert, Stay Safe:

- Always be aware of your surroundings and report any suspicious activity.
- Trust your instincts. If something doesn't seem right, it's important to report it immediately.
- Security is a shared responsibility together, we create a safe environment for all.
